

[Globalization and Criminal Justice: Critical Issues \(DAVID NELKEN\)](#)

The course explores the difficulties of comparing different national responses to crimes and harms. It also asks how globalisation is affecting these responses. Attention will also be given to such transnational challenges as organised crime, corruption and human trafficking. Students will be expected to prepare two short papers during the course.

The course on Global Social Indicators offers students the possibility to do guided research into case-studies of global social indicators so as to examine the different ways in which social indicators are made and applied across a wide range of social problem areas. A good background in sociology and willingness to write essays is required to do well in this course.
